Schumpeter 2010

Innovation, Organisation, Sustainability and Crises

Aalborg University, Denmark, 21-24 June 2010

In this final call, we have moved the deadline for submission of papers/ extended abstracts to 28th February 2010. We are also happy to announce that registration and payment of the conference fee have started at a separate website (aalborg-convention.dk/registration/schumpeter2010). Please check the conference fees in the call and the available hotel information before using this site. NOTE: When payment has been completed once through the registration site, additional payments cannot be made. Therefore, plan your stay carefully (including hotel requirements) before completing the registration.

The Schumpeter Society

The International Joseph A. Schumpeter Society has more than 400 members from 40 countries. The Society publishes the *Journal of Evolutionary Economics* and awards the Schumpeter prize. Since the founding conference in 1986, the Society has held biannual open-call conferences. After Aalborg in 2010, the next conference will be held in Australia in 2012 at the University of Queensland. Examples of previous conferences are the 11th Schumpeter Conference in Nice (2006) and the 12th Schumpeter Conference in Rio de Janeiro (2008).

The 2010 Conference

As in the case of the previous Schumpeter Conferences, the 2010 Conference at Aalborg University serves as an opportunity for both established scholars and young researchers to present research that has a Schumpeterian perspective. The major topic of the 2010 conference is "Innovation, Organisation, Sustainability and Crises". But the conference more generally embraces micro-studies of the innovation, routine

and selection as well as studies of the macro-problems of Schumpeterian growth and development as a process of “creative destruction”. The broad range of issues implies that both economists, business economists, and other social scientists can contribute to the conference and that evidence may be provided by statistical and historical methods as well as other methods.

The Conference Programme

The Schumpeter Conference 2010 encourages the presentation of novel insights and the stimulation of lively debates about important Schumpeter-inspired questions. This encouragement covers contributions to the plenary sessions as well as contributions to the parallel sessions. We invite researchers as soon as possible to email ideas for areas of contributions and discussions to the organisers (info@schumpeter2010.dk). Furthermore, those authors whose papers have been accepted will not only have to classify their contributions by means of a predefined list of topics but can also add topics that seem better fitted for their contributions.

The open-ended list of conference topics includes:

- Schumpeterian and Keynesian perspectives on economic crises
- Cyclical and trend movements in the global economy: macroeconomic analyses
- Eco-innovation, technological learning and sustainable development
- Technological change and industrial evolution in economic development
- Technical change, income distribution, and inequality
- Determinants and patterns of emergence of new technological paradigms
- National systems of innovation: taking stock of the evidence
- The micro-economic foundations of macroeconomic dynamics (both cyclical and long term properties)
- Changing boundaries between market and non market organisation
- Patterns of spatial agglomeration and their evolution
- Incentives and capabilities in the theory of organisations
- Work organisation, organisational learning and innovation
- The role of market selection in economic dynamics: theory and evidence
- The evolution of demand and consumption patterns
- Evolutionary interpretations of financial market dynamics
- Evolutionary approaches to science, technology and innovation policies

Paper Submission and Acceptance

Submissions can **only be made through www.schumpeter2010.dk**.

1. Summary of the submission process

- Deadline for **paper/abstract submission: 28th February 2010**.
- Decision of **paper/abstract acceptance: 1st April 2010**.
- Deadline for author's promise to present the paper: 20th April 2010.
- Registration deadline at reduced rates: 10th May 2010.
- Deadline for full or revised versions of accepted papers: 31st May 2010.
- Conference programme will be available at the website: 3rd June 2010.
- Final deadline for conference registration: 10th June 2010 (for participants not in the conference programme).

2. Proposal submission

Scholars who wish to present their research at the conference must upload **an extended abstract** (2-3 pages) **OR a full paper** (normally not exceeding 10,000 words) **no later than 28th February 2010**. The procedure is described on the first page of the conference website.

Authors may submit more than one paper, but each participant will only be allowed to present one paper during the conference. Co-authored papers may be presented by any of the participating co-authors.

Submission grants permission to the conference organisers to make accepted papers and extended abstracts publically available at the conference website.

3. Paper acceptance

Papers or extended abstracts will be reviewed anonymously by at least two reviewers. The decision of paper **acceptance is given before 1st April 2010** (and it will not include review or comments).

Papers not accepted for oral presentation at the conference may be accepted for presentation in *poster sessions*.

Authors of accepted papers/abstracts must *before 20th April 2010* promise to present their paper at the conference **and** give information on its classification. Otherwise, their paper will automatically be removed from the conference programme.

4. Revised/full paper submission and the programme

Full or revised versions of accepted papers can be submitted until 31st May 2010.

The conference programme based on the full papers and posters will be available at the website by 3rd June 2010.

The Schumpeter Prize

The International Joseph A. Schumpeter Society is pleased to announce the 12th Schumpeter Prize Competition. The price is awarded every two years in recognition of a recent scholarly contribution related to Schumpeter's work. It carries a cash reward of 10,000 EURO. The present award has been designed by the managing board of the society and concerns the topic "Innovation, Organisation, Sustainability and Crises".

Entries must be postmarked **no later than 28th February 2010**. Works submitted may either be of article or book length; and there is no page or format specification. Submissions will be judged by an international scientific committee and the winner will be announced at the Schumpeter Prize Dinner in connection with the 2010 Schumpeter Conference.

Schumpeter Prize submissions should be sent as an original and four additional copies to: Professor Franco Malerba, KITeS, Università Bocconi, Grafton Building, Via Roentgen 1, Milano, 20136 Italy. The Best Junior Paper Award

The 2010 Conference introduces the Best Junior Paper Award of 1,000 EURO. Participation in this prize competition requires that a full paper is submitted in the ordinary way through the conference website and has in the ordinary way been accepted for the conference. Then the conference organisers have to be informed that the author(s) wish the paper to be evaluated later than **20th April 2010**. It should be stated that all authors are PhD students or have got their PhD degree less than 5 years ago.

Fees and Registration for the Conference

While the ordinary conference website is used for the submission of paper proposals, **registration, payment of fees and booking of hotels** take place through a **separate website** (aalborg-convention.dk/registration/schumpeter2010). Please check the conference fees in the call and the available hotel information before using this site. When entering the separate registration website, you have to enter your personal information. Then you can pay the registration fee and book from a selection of hotels near the conference site. NOTE: When payment has been completed once through the registration site, additional payments cannot be made. Therefore, plan your stay carefully before completing the registration.

Early registration (by 10 May 2010):

- Members of the Schumpeter Society 300 EURO.
- Non-members 400 EURO.
- PhD students 150 EURO.
- Accompanying person 150 EURO.

Late registration (after 10 May 2010) increases the fee by 100 EURO. Final deadline for conference registration (participants not in the programme): 10th June 2010.
